WE ARE NOT ALONE

One of the most poignant passages in the Bible concerns loneliness. Loneliness is a terrible feeling. And loneliness is a terrible reality. What if we truly were all alone? What if there was no one there for us? The prophet Elijah experienced the deepest feelings of loneliness. The prophet Elijah was truly all alone. After his dramatic victory over the prophets of Baal he was pursued by the wicked queen Jezebel. He fled from her in fear, and he sat down under a broom tree. Fittingly we are told the tree was a solitary broom tree. This deep feeling of being alone leads to an encounter with God, where Elijah tells the Lord the depths of his despair, pouring out his heart as he tells God twice, "I alone am left..." In other words, the prophet says, "I am all alone." It is at this lowest point of utter despair that Elijah discovers two things. First, God is with him. Secondly, although Elijah feels all alone, God lets him know he is not all alone. There are seven thousand others, in fact, who have not bowed down to worship the gods of Baal.

That feeling of being all alone hit close to home during COVID. For a long time, we were isolated. For a long time, we were prevented from seeing others. For a long time, we were not able to gather together as a church family, not able to gather for fellowship, for friendship, for growing in faith, and, not able to gather together for worship. It was during that time that the idea for a sermon series came to mind. The idea was to preach a series of sermons titled, "Partners in faith." I wanted to convey to folks that we are not alone. Obviously, like Elijah we have God. We always have God. God has promised he will never leave us and never forsake us. Of course we have God. And, also like Elijah, we have partners in faith whom we can learn from and whom we can lean on. These partners in faith are the biblical figures that fill the pages of the Bible. Through their encounters with God and their journey with God, I hoped that we could find strength and encouragement and guidance for our journey of faith, even during the lonely days of COVID.

As we all know, we are not living under the strict edicts of isolation that marked the early days of COVID. And yet that feeling of loneliness lingers for many. With the goal of reminding us that we are not alone, I am going to be preaching a series that will cover the majority of the year. The series will be about partners in faith. We will look at a wide range of the biblical figures. By looking at and learning from their encounters with God, my hope is that we will all discover that we are not alone in our journey of life, and we are not alone in our journey of faith.

Along with the sermon series "Partners in faith," I am also inviting you to join me on what I am calling a "Walk in the Word." Throughout 2024 I will offer a Bible study Wednesdays at noon that will give us the opportunity to walk through the Word of God and grow in our understanding of some of the key moments that make up the biblical witness. This "Walk in the Word" will take us through: THE BOOK OF GENESIS (Lent: February 21-March 27)

THE BOOK OF ACTS (April 17– May 22, which will cover the Season of Pentecost)
THE BOOK OF EXODUS (June 5–26)
THE LETTERS OF PAUL (Late summer and fall)

God has given us the wonderful gift of being a church family, a community of faith. "Our Chapter was recognized by the SHP Board of Directors, as the Chapter out of all 340+ Chapters, with the largest increase (119%) of deliveries 2022 - 2023. We delivered 732 beds in 2022 and 1,603 beds in 2023.

Sadly, with over 3% of kids 3 to 17-years-old in our community sleeping on the floor, on a couch, or sharing a mattress with multiple people (and that's a conservative estimate!), we have a lot of work to do in 2024.

The support and help from APC and our new Humble delivery Hub helped us reach this 119% increase, so thank you all!! We are indeed living out our belief that we are all Servants to our Brothers and Sisters."

Becoming Carbon Neutral In Your Church and In Your Life Summary of seminar attended on January 13

On January 13, Gary Denmon and Forrest and Shelley Craig attended an interesting seminar at St. Philip Presbyterian Church: "Becoming Carbon Neutral In Your Church and In Your Life." A total of 43 attendees shared experiences (in-person and via ZOOM) representing eight churches in our Presbytery.

Joe Schwarz of Webster Pres discussed how to quantify a church's carbon footprint using "Cool Congregation" tools provided by Interfaith Power & Light (t.ly/EhZqK). These tools help prioritize actions to reduce carbon footprints and provide estimates of progress.

Other presentations and discussions included the following:

- St. Philip Pres and Webster Pres discussed their experiences with active solar panel systems.
- Webster presented their adaptation of motion activation light switches.
- Forrest shared APC's use of LED retrokits to convert CLC classroom fluorescent light to LED.
- Woodlands Community and St. Thomas explained the benefits of native plants.
- St. Philip discussed their efforts to manage water use on a large campus.
- Woodlands Community described their recent energy audit and invited everyone to attend the consultant's presentation of the results on Sunday, February 4 at 4 pm.
- Interfaith Power & Light's household carbon footprint tool was explained. Discussion focused on what individuals can do to reduce their carbon footprint.

The attendees shared "best practices," resources, and other thoughts about how churches and individuals can do our part to reduce our carbon footprint as good stewards.
